Emmy award-winning Spectrum News NY1 anchor and host Cheryl Wills will interview Jordan and Lendrum. The 200 guests will also hear from The Bowery Mission's President & CEO, David P. Jones and a client of The Bowery Mission's Women's Centers.

At The Bowery Mission Women's Centers, clients make progress toward individualized goals by accessing comprehensive services for physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual healing—all in the context of a safe, dignified, supportive community. Each woman has suffered trauma due to a variety of causes: poverty, homelessness, addiction cycles, health crises, job loss or domestic violence. Vocational readiness training helps women transition from homelessness to independence and meaningful work.

Each meal and every service is an invitation to residential and community programs that help clients make progress. Each year, the Mission serves 350 adults in its residential recovery programs and 800 more at the Community Hope Resource Center. To empower children to thrive and succeed, The Bowery Mission also offers year-round opportunities for enrichment through City Camp, culminating in summer camp for 900 children in the Poconos Region of Pennsylvania.
